Autumn Term

- The tasks described below are designed to be meaningful and enjoyable activities that you can do with the support and involvement of other members of your family.
- The tasks, shown in red, must be completed.
- You may then choose to do as many of the other activities as you wish one, two or even all of them, it's up to you!

Multiplication Test:

By the end of Year 4, ALL children will complete the new government multiplication test.

To help children prepare for this test, please encourage your child to practise their times tables **regularly** at home and complete their weekend monster maths challenges.

Spellings:

Children will each have common exception words in their reading diaries. They need to practise spelling these at home. New words will be issued once they can spell the set of words in their diaries.

Regular Reading

Read daily to an adult or share what has happened in your story with an adult. Don't forget to return a signed reading record to earn some golden time.

It doesn't have to be a story. It could be a poem, a leaflet from a place you have visited; newspaper article or sports magazine.

Design and create an Anglo Saxon brooch. Find out what they were used for.
