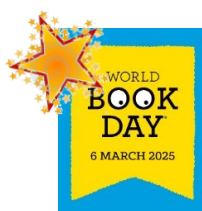
Just a reminder...

Every Day Counts....

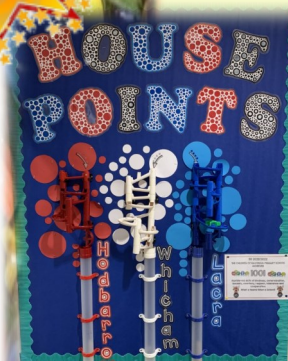

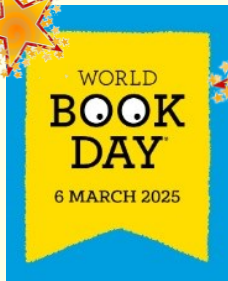
Key daily timings:

Weekly Attendance Report

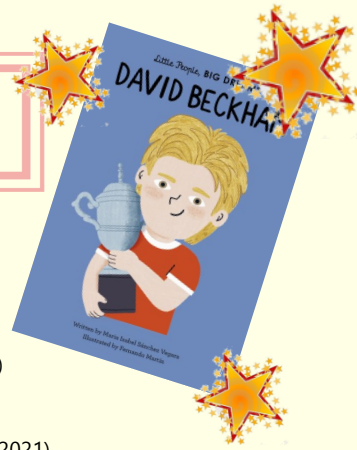

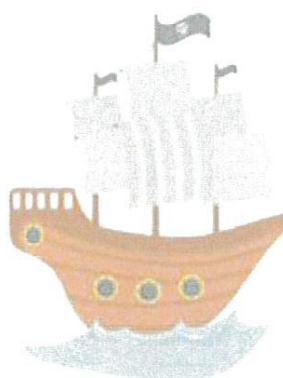

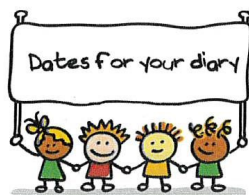
